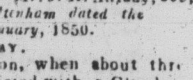

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Four days later from California. The steamer Cherokee, from Chicago, with San Francisco dates to Dec. 3, a heavy mail, \$1,799,000 on freight and \$330,000 in the hands of a large number of passengers, arrived at New York on Thursday morning.

The passage has occupied 261 days from San Francisco to New York, and would have been made in some days less time but for a succession of heavy gales during the voyage in the Caribbean sea.

The steamer Golden Gate left San Francisco Dec. 5. She had on her manifest \$2,400,000 in gold, and a large amount in the hands of the passengers.

The general news from California is not important. Extensive limestone and marble formations have been discovered on the American river within thirty miles of Sacramento. The snags on the Yuba and Feather rivers have been removed at an expense of \$15,000.

Murders in the interior continue, though somewhat checked by the efforts of the Vigilance Committee. A company has secured the exclusive right of steam navigation to the Sandwich Islands under the name of the North-Pacific Steam Navigation Company.

A new route has been discovered across the Sierra Nevada, said to be superior to any other. At San Francisco, Sacramento, and other places, a good deal of rain had fallen subsequent to the first of the month, and the wet season appears to have fairly set in.

Latest from England. The steamer Cambria arrived at Halifax at 2 o'clock on the evening of the 13th inst., bringing Liverpool dates to the 27th of December. She brought off 23 passengers, only one landing at Halifax.

The demand for Cotton had been good, and sellers were enabled to obtain a little better prices. The total sales for the week amounted to 34,360 bales.

The Grain market was without any material change. Flour was in good demand at full rates. Lord Palmerston has suddenly retired from the office of Foreign Secretary, to the amazement and regret of the whole nation.

The English funds continued buoyant during the week, and closed on the 24th at an improvement. Consols 97 and 3/4 ex dividend.

The iron house of John Barclay, Buchanan street, Glasgow, has suspended payment. His liabilities amount to £100,000. A member of an extensive dry-goods business in Liverpool had absconded, after misappropriating funds to the amount of £50,000.

The Austrian Ambassador at the Court of St. James, and now at Brussels, has received order to proceed immediately to his post. Ireland - It would appear that the return of many Irish emigrants to their own country had attracted considerable attention in Ireland, as to very many instances the expectations had been by no means realized.

The latest news from Paris, by Telegraph of the 27th Dec., gives the votes of 51 Departments, of which 23 were complete, years 6,011,000, says 705,000. There was much speculation as to the new Press law shortly to be promulgated. The best informed think that each Journal would have to deposit a certain sum with the Government as a security for their good behaviour.
