Summer School Of Science In Kingston.

A Summer School of Science for the benefit of Public and High School teachers, and others, will be opened on July 4th, 1894, and continue in session for five weeks. Courses of lectures and demonstrations will be given on Chemistry, Physics, Geology, Mineralogy, Botany, Zoology and Physiology, by members of the staff of Queen's University and of the School of Mining and Agriculture.
