Phillimore, M. D. The poetry of the number is contributed by J. H. Long, J. Millar Barr, G. E. Theodore Roberts, Gertrude Bartlett, Charlotte Grant Macintyre, and Wm. H. Drummond, M. D. Miss M. M. Kilpatrick, in "The Literary Kingdom," evinces literary ability, humour and critical discernment.
