

YUGOSLAVIA

Yugoslavia has a fishing fleet of reputable size, with the number of boats in the sea fleet totalling approximately 290 vessels. There are around twenty fisheries in Yugoslavia that catch, produce and distribute fresh, frozen and canned fish. The main catch and production species in Yugoslavia are sardines, mackerel and tuna. In 1988, the total catch for the sector was 44,625 tonnes, comprised of 36,302 tonnes of bluefish, 5,945 tonnes of other fish, 893 tonnes of cephalopoda, 814 tonnes of clams, and 671 tonnes of crab. The importers below are the larger producers/packers, whereas there are also smaller companies operating in the fishery sector.
