RESOLUTION 38.

A Resolution for the relief of Rita Emma Carlon
Michaud.

[Adopted 23rd February, 1966.]

WHEREAS Rita Emma Carlon Michaud, residing at the city of St. Jerome, in the province of Quebec, wife of Rene Albert Michaud, otherwise known as Rene Aubin, who is domiciled in Canada, in the province of Quebec, and temporarily residing at the city of Seattle, in the state of Washington, one of the United States of America, has by her petition alleged that they were married on the second day of February, A.D. 1952, at the city of Baltimore, in the state of Maryland, one of the United States of America, she then being Rita Emma Carlon; and whereas by her petition she has prayed that, on the ground of his adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of her petition be granted: Therefore the Senate of Canada, pursuant to the provisions of the DISSOLUTION AND ANNULMENT OF MARRIAGES ACT and subject to section 2 thereof, resolves as follows:—

1. On the expiration of thirty days from the date of the adoption by the Senate of this resolution, the said marriage shall be dissolved and thenceforth shall be null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.
