I recognize there is some movement now to modify that situation to allow some individuals on welfare to take a job and not be penalized. That is a positive step.

I wish I had more time to elaborate, but I see Mr. Speaker, that you have signalled to tell me that my time is up. This one case I have outlined of a guaranteed annual income where

there is no built-in disincentive allows people to earn what they can, be it a part-time job or a low income job. To know that your family has sufficient income is a responsibility of this Parliament, and as soon as we can we should put in place the mechanisms to let that occur.

Thank you for your indulgence, Mr. Speaker. I look forward to reasonably quick passage of Bill C-11 so we can get the money into the hands of the people who need it.
