

Mr. Robb then obtained leave to present a Bill. No. 365, An Act for granting to His Majesty certain sums of money for the public service of the financial year ending the 31st March, 1930, which was read the first time.

By leave of the House, the said Bill was read the second time, considered in Committee of the Whole, reported without amendment, read the third time and passed.
