Dear Mr. Hasler,

I received your note of the 31st yesterday, and am sorry to have to tell you that it will be impossible for me to meet Mr. Parks tonight.

I have every sympathy for the German students who have been driven out of Germany by the action of Mr. Hitler, but I frankly confess that I have more sympathy for the students who have been driven out of McGill because they lack financial resources to see them through. I have in mind an unusually brilliant student who, because of financial reverses suffered by his parents, has had to withdraw from the University.

I believe in international student organizations. I believe many students in German universities have suffered persecution. I would throw no cold water on efforts to help them, but were I able to contribute more than I do now, I should give my support here.
