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neighbour, or friend, must not be offended, if I have been obliged occasionally, in the prosecution of the plan of this little essay, to put forward some unpalat-When I thought, I had able truths. justifiable grounds for finding fault, I have done so unreservedly and freely; conscious that my intention in doing so was good; and presuming that, a proper construction would be put on my candour. I have found by experience, that putting a thing, appearing objectionable, in a ludicrous point of view, was the best and most efficacious mode, of making a lasting impression upon the mind-that such a style of speaking or writing was more calculated to be profitable in the end, when addressed to the individual or to a community, than if the same ideas were differently conveyed, gravely, in the form of the most unanswerable logic, or brilliantly, in the witching garb of the most embellished eloquence. I have therefore made merry occasionally, at the expense, of the ignorant husbandman, certainly, not for the purpose of insulting or hurting his feelings, but in the fond expectation, of eventually guiding and permanently serving him.
