Le *Morning Chronicle* lui consacra les lignes suivantes :

"Another of our old, respected and well known citizens, has passed away in the person of Pierre Martial Bardy, Esquire, M. D. who died last Sunday evening. The deceased was born in the 30th November 1797, and had, thus, reached his 72nd year. He commenced his studies at the Quebec Seminary ; and after a course of general and scientific study, both in this city and that of Montreal, was there admitted to the practice of Medicine and Surgery in 1829. In 1834, Dr. Bardy was elected to represent the County of Rouville in the Legislative Assembly ; and he attached himself to the party of Hon. Mr. Papineau, to whom he adhered during even the troublesome times of 1837. The deceased was also the founder of the St-Jean-Baptiste Society of Quebec with which he continued connected many years, including that which saw the erection of the Ste-Foye Monument and the memorable imposing ceremonies attending its inauguration. He filled various offices of trust, honor and usefulness, in this city, during the earlier
