NEWCASTLE, England, July 15.—(Can. Press.)—The board of trade court of enquiry into the disappearance of the Mount Oswald, a trans-Atlantic freight steamer, which disappeared on her voyage from Baltimore to Hamburg in February, 1912, found today that the vessel was unseaworthy when the pilot left her in Chesapeake Bay. The court, however, was unable to state definitely the cause of her loss, which it could not say was due to a wrongful act of her owners, Messrs. Lunn and McCoy of Newcastle. It considered them guilty, however, of a grave error of judgment in not having the ship docked at New York, as requested by the captain.

WOMAN KILLED BY MOTORCYCLE

MISS CARRIE HOWELLS RUN DOWN AND FATALLY INJURED ON COLLEGE STREET.

RECEIVING A FRACTURE OF THE SKULL, when she was knocked down by a motorcycle, ridden by Howard Smith, 56 Vermont street, at the corner of Lippincott and College streets, at noon yesterday, Miss Carrie Howells of 77 Matland street was rushed in an unconscious condition to the Western Hospital, where she died an hour later.

According to the police, Smith was going west on College street at a moderate speed, when the woman, who was about 38 years of age, stepped from the sidewalk, directly in front of the cycle. She was picked up unconscious, taken to H. A. Spotswood's drug store at the corner, and then removed to the hospital in Ellis ambulance.

The body was removed to the morgue last night, and an inquest will be held.
