"Mrs. Leffingwell's Boots"

Many of the plays from the pen of Augustus Thomas are noted for their ingenious and novel plots. "Mrs. Leffingwell's Boots," which Miss Haswell will present at the Alexandra Theatre next week, is no exception to the rule.

The storm prevents the guests from arriving with the exception of Mrs. Leffingwell, whose boots have been the cause of the trouble. 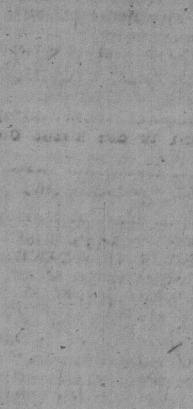
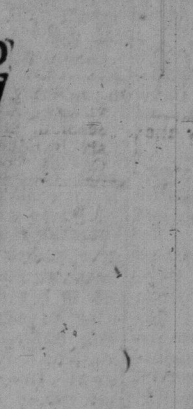
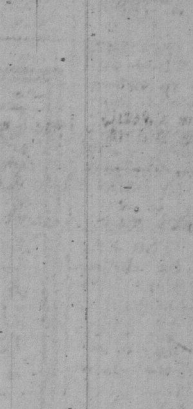
