The appointment of W. E. Raney, K.C., of Toronto, as attorney-general for the government, will have a bearing on the racing situation in the province. The new minister is an honest, conscientious objector to all forms of gambling, which includes betting on the horses, the kind he has always regarded with abhorrence in the legislative council will please the anti-racing and furnish the pros, the horse owners and trainers, with a powerful ally in the racing legislation is enacted at Ottawa, the Ontario government can have no objection to the racing laws, the taxing of courses and the like.

According to an Ottawa despatch itemized in the "Horseman" the problem of race track betting will be introduced at the regular session of parliament in the fall. The bill will exempt the members who will open early in the new year. It will be based upon recommendations made by the Hon. J. D. Rutherford, the commissioner appointed by the government in August to thoroughly probe the whole matter, including such questions as the character and methods of operation of race meets, the effect of the racing industry upon the community and the effect of the law upon the production and sale of horses of thorough stock.

Dr. Rutherford has held trials for the taking of evidence in all parts of Canada, excepting the Maritime Provinces, and has been in the province since previous to his departure for the west with the railway board last night, Dr. Rutherford is a man of great value for him to hold a few more sittings in the east subsequent to the completion of the telegram delivery hearing in the west. His report, he said, would be ready for parliament before it meets.

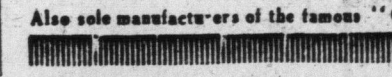
