Municipal Legislators Meet at St.
Catharines to Discuss Questions of Government.

EX-MAYOR KEATING PRESIDENT.

Resolution Passed Touching the
Attempted Assassination of
Mr. McKim.

St. Catharines, Sept. 11.—The third annual meeting of the Ontario Municipal Association opened in the County Buildings here today at 2 o'clock. The attendance is not large as yet, but many delegates will be in for the Association's business session. The officers of the association were elected as follows: President, M. Y. Keating, St. Catharines; 1st vice-president, R. E. Nelson, Guelph; 2nd vice-president, T. P. McKeown, Toronto; secretary, H. K. Hunt, Hamilton; assistant secretary, John T. Hall, Hamilton. The convention was opened this year by President Keating's presidential address.

Following Mr. Keating's speech, Mayor McKim made a short, spirited address, welcoming the visitors. He then turned over to the town solicitor, Brockville, responded on behalf of the association.

The standing committees were then appointed.

It was moved by Ald. Charles A. Wilson of St. Catharines, seconded by Ald. W. P. Hubbard of Toronto, that the representatives of the various municipal organizations of the province be invited to the city of St. Catharines to place on record their deep sense of regret in connection with the recent assassination attempt at the residence of the president of the United States.

Our sympathy goes out to "the people to the south of us" in their hour of anxiety, and we join in their prayers for the speedy recovery of the president.

The resolutions of the association were then adopted.

Governor Voorhees Heard of N. Y. Sept. 11.—The world today will say: When the attention of Governor Voorhees of New Jersey was called to the report from Montreal regarding the assassination attempt at the residence of the president of the United States, he said: "I said a week ago that I recently received word from three different sources that plots to assassinate one or more political heads of their respective countries had been hatched in New York. I was then told that the plot was carried out as soon as the opportunity presented itself. I will say now that one of these plots was that which has been made by the police of Montreal. I am so far from being able to locate the conspirators in any of these cases."

PROTEST FROM "C" BATTERY

Men of Making Resolve Not to Parade in Toronto for the Duke
UNLESS THEIR CLAIMS ARE SETTLED.

They Also Object to Coming Here to Receive Their War Medals.

Hamilton, Sept. 11.—The members of "C" Battery, that did such effective service in the relief of Mafeking, have not given up their protest against the parade by the Dominion Government because of the bonus of five shillings a day given them by the Rhodesian Government. Of the battery, 30 volunteered from Hamilton and district, and a large number of the men met at the Horseshoe Inn to discuss the matter. The protest was signed by the men and they resolved to refuse to parade in Toronto for the Duke unless their claims are settled.

JOINT ACTION SUGGESTED

United States May Co-Operate With Canada to Prevent Dynamiting of Fish.

DUKE'S VISIT PARALYZED TRADE.

Ottawa, Sept. 11.—The Department of Marine and Fisheries has communicated with United States Senator Hale relative to action being taken to prevent the dynamiting of fish in Canadian and American waters.

The Canadian proposition is to make it a criminal offense either to land at a Canadian port fish killed by dynamite or to export such fish to any other country.
