

OLEOMARGARINE IS LIKELY TO BECOME A CANADIAN FOOD

Food Controller's Sub-Committee Approves.

TALK MILK SITUATION

Insufficient Data on Production to Warrant Action.

OTTAWA, Oct. 18.—When the committee appointed by the food controller to investigate the price of milk resumed sessions this morning, it was found that the data on milk production was not quite ready. Chairman Austin said that responses to the questionnaire had been gratifying and that the distributors were ready for the most part to lay before the committee details of the cost of production of milk in Canada.

The session then proceeded to a discussion of the advisability of recommending that the ban on importation and manufacture in Canada of oleomargarine be raised during the war. The majority of those present were decidedly in favor of permitting margarine to be brought into the country as a substitute for butter, in view of the fact that the rapidly increasing cost of butter would prohibit its use among a large section of the community. Dealers thought that the use of margarine would not affect adversely the butter trade, either from the point of view of the farmers or the dealers. A resolution was put to the meeting, with every possibility that it will be passed, recommending that the food controller be authorized to permit oleomargarine to be imported and sold in Canada for public sale.

SPAIN LETS PART OF U-BOAT CREW ESCAPE; SUB GOT AWAY LATELY

FERROL, Spain, Oct. 18.—The commander and sixteen sailors of German submarine U-23, who were interned with German refugees from the Kamerun, near Aloia de Henares, northwest of Madrid, have escaped. The second officer in command, and the six remaining sailors have been placed under close guard.

On October 8 it was announced from Madrid that a German submarine had been interned at Cadix had escaped. The Spanish Government, it was said, later had instituted a court martial to deal with the affair and had taken measures to punish the German naval officers in immediate charge of the interned vessel.

VICTORIA CROSS WON BY LT. KING FOR BRAVE DEED

Young Simcoe Officer Raided Hun Trench and Saved Comrade.

SIMCOE, Oct. 18.—Lieut. Hope King, eldest son of W. J. King, has been awarded the Victoria Cross, according to information just received in a letter from the front. The letter states that Lieut. King, with another officer, raided a German trench, and held it for half an hour. Lieut. King had his left forearm broken, and was hit in both thighs by shrapnel. When raiding from the trench, notwithstanding a heavy machine gun and shellfire directed by the Germans, he carried out on his shoulders a comrade who had been wounded. Lieut. King is at present in a hospital at Manchester recovering. He enlisted with a Winnipeg battalion. A brother, Geoffrey, who went over with the 125th Battalion, is at present in the trenches.

Pt. B. Burt Peters, a former bandman in the 125th Battalion, now a dispatch rider with the 4th Battalion, has won the Military Medal. No particulars have as yet been received.

FUND REACHES \$1,700.
WINDSOR, Oct. 18.—As a result of a canvass made by officers of Windsor Sportsmen's Patriotic Society, the fund to provide furniture for the new soldiers' home here has now reached \$1,700, including \$500 donated by the Windsor Hockey Club. Detroit Chapter of the Daughters of the Empire has donated a large Union Jack, which will be hoisted when the home is opened some time in November.

SEVENTY WANT EXEMPTION. CHATHAM, Oct. 18.—Only one man has reported at the Chatham postoffice for service under the military service act. Seventy have filed exemption claims. The medical board examined 91 here yesterday. Forty-two were found physically fit, and 47 rejected. Major Frederick Stanbury has assumed charge of the administration duties of the board at the office in the armories.

WOULD EMBARGO N. B. POTATOES TO POINTS WEST OF MONTREAL

Merchant Says Ontario Crops Is Boost.
MONTREAL, Oct. 18.—"Because people in Toronto are demanding Green Mountain potatoes, which have to be carried from New Brunswick, the price of these potatoes in Ontario seeking a market. Just because they are not blessed with the same Green Mountain potatoes, and they are consequently selling at \$1.50 and \$1.00 laid down in Montreal. The Green Mountain variety sell at \$2.15 to \$2.25 a bag. Toronto people are wasting precious freight space and coal, hauling them a thousand miles.

"There is a chance for the food controller," Ward declared. "Let him place an embargo on New Brunswick potatoes shipped to points west of Montreal."

PASTORS' SALARIES TO BE DISCUSSED AT BAPTIST CONVENTION

Many Now Only Getting \$375 a Year and Free House.

WOODSTOCK, Oct. 18.—At tonight's meeting of the Baptists of Ontario and Quebec, Indian missions were discussed at length. J. B. McLaurin, D.D., declared that India had in the past given China and Japan their religion, and probably would continue to do so. Therefore the church must consider India as the strategic centre of the east.

Mr. McLaurin referred to the fact that early in the war a report reached India that King George had been captured and carried to Germany in an aeroplane, but the natives soon realized that the story was not true when they saw how unconcerned the missionaries continued to go about their work.

Officials of the Indian Government had declared that no other agency was so potent in British India as mission work. Mr. McLaurin declared India was thoroughly loyal to Britain.

Dr. Allan and Smith, who had been in Telaga, India, as missionaries, stated that one of the great needs is proper medical work among the natives, who were very friendly toward the Christians.

In the afternoon a very interesting report was given by Rev. O. E. Kendall of Delhi on the subject of ministers' salaries. A great deal of discussion followed, and the subject proved such an interesting one that the convention found itself unable to deal with it effectively in the time at its disposal.

The program committee therefore was asked to arrange for a further discussion of the same subject later.

A number of queries addressed to between three and four hundred ministers for the purpose of gathering statistics as to salaries, brought 175 replies containing information which the delegates found of quite absorbing interest. They showed among other things that a surprisingly large proportion of Baptist ministers receive salaries of only \$275 a year and a free house, out of which many of them have to pay for the keep of a horse. Only nine out of those who replied to the salary query were in receipt of salaries in excess of \$400 a year. Only 42 of those who reported have other incomes besides their salaries, and 38 reported that the smallness of their stipends militated against their efficiency as preachers and ministers. Seven reported to the contrary.

PRELIMINARY MEETING TO ALLIED CONFERENCE

Problems of Supplying Corn and Coal Discussed.
WASHINGTON, Oct. 18.—Romanian dispatches received here today announce that the parliamentary mission of England, France and Italy, have met at Monte Citorio, Italy, preparatory to the general inter-parliamentary conference in London in November.

As a result of the meeting three sub-committees have been named to report at the conference on the problems of supplying and distributing coal and corn for the allies and also to discuss the best means of coping with the submarine campaign, both in the northern seas and in the Mediterranean.
