THE COST OF PROVIDING BRAILLE BOOKS IS GREAT

Number of Toronto Organizations Endeavor to Help Returned Men.

Interest in the blind has been sharpened to some extent in Toronto by the return of a number of soldiers who have lost their sight in the war.

A few organizations—the Women's Musical Club, among the number—have taken upon themselves the specific task of raising funds to help those so pathetically afflicted, but the interest, keen as it may be in certain associations, is by no means so general as the situation demands.

A good idea of the cost of providing books for the blind is given in a little pamphlet, "Our Blind Soldiers and the Canadian Free Library for the Blind," in which it is pointed out by a concrete instance that it takes many times more to supply this literature than it does to procure books for the normal of the population, and a great deal more than is ever imagined by those not acquainted with the subject.

The pamphlet points out that the cost of the ordinary high school copy of Green's History of England is \$1.50 and the same work in the Braille alphabet for the blind costs \$27.50. This one illustration alone is sufficient to emphasize the outlay entailed in procuring reading matter for the blind, yet as this is so necessary to the pleasure and in some instances to the livelihood of this class of the community, the knowledge ought to enlarge our givings where such is at all possible.
