To the Electors of West Middlesex

Gentlemen,—

Some time ago I announced myself as an independent Liberal candidate in West Middlesex for election to the Legislature of Ontario.

I have never withdrawn that announcement, but a change of circumstances in the riding led me to further desire to defer to the wishes of the electors of the Liberal Association for West Middlesex, as well as to await the action of a new convention upon the candidature of a gentleman whose position as a national candidate for a second time has been injuriously affected by a change of the boundaries of the riding, whose claims as leading agriculturist and as a life-long Liberal I would have been pleased to see recognized.

Now, after a conference with Mr. McDougall, the ex-president, and in deference to his wishes and to those of other prominent Liberals, I have decided to repeat the announcement previously made by me, and request the honor of your support in the ensuing election.

In making this announcement I follow, as I have previously said, a long and honorable practice, which must again be resorted to in this country if party conventions, which are an American institution, should be permitted to consist of delegates appointed at the instance of the candidate, instead of being the voluntary expression of the will of the party, to which I shall always be liberal to submit in the case of a candidate, when that will is properly expressed.

I have already published a statement of my views as an independent Liberal upon many of the most important questions of the day, and I have no doubt that I have an opportunity of addressing you personally, if elected, I shall support more advanced and progressive Liberalism from whomever it comes, and devote myself, as in duty bound, to the interests of my constituents.
