Our Western and Boston papers received by the last New-York Mail, have put us in possession of London intelligence to the 26th July, a day or two later than our previous advices from that metropolis.

On the 26th July, the Chancellor of the Exchequer submitted his financial statement to the House of Commons. The receipts for the year ending on the 5th, were £16,914,586, and the expenditures £14,757,550, leaving a surplus of income over expenditure of £2,157,036.

The Paris Constitutional states, that the Cabinet of St. Petersburg has demanded from England an explanation of her extraordinary armaments in the Mediterranean, and adds, that England is perfectly aware of what is going on at Constantinople, and therefore sees the necessity of striking a decisive blow, which she is now preparing to do.

The Morning Herald of the 26th mentions a report of the death of Mr. Coleridge, the poet, on the day previous. No doubt in any longer entertained of the entrance of Don Carlos into Spain. He travelled in disguise from London to Paris, and through France to Bayonne, and crossing the Spanish frontier on horseback, accompanied only by a French officer, joined the army of the insurgents, making his headquarters at the village of Pampeluna.

No action had taken place between Don Carlos and Baltho, so lately as the 20th. The army of the former consisted of 2000 men, and that of the latter of 2000 men. He had published a decree, declaring Zea Bermudez, Conde Alcala, Gen. Carrion, Antonio Martinez, and Gaspar Gonzalez, traitors in consequence of their proclamation of Isabella II. He is said to have appointed M. Castello his ambassador to Berlin, and to have appointed M. de Los Rios to Berlin, Alvarez de Toledo to Vienna, and the Marquis of Labrador at Rome.

The banker of Don Carlos at Paris, M. Jauges, had been arrested and imprisoned, in pursuance of a warrant issued from the private cabinet of the Prefect of Police. A London paper says:—M. Jauges was committed under the charge of the crimes set forth in the following articles of the penal code:—Art. 70. The penalty expressed in articles 70 and 77 (death), shall be the same, whether the inclinations or manoeuvres specified in the said articles, shall have been committed towards France, or towards the allies of France sitting against the common enemy.

It is stated in the London papers, that an American vessel, with 10,000 stand of arms on board for the service of Don Carlos, had been prevented from clearing at the Taines.
