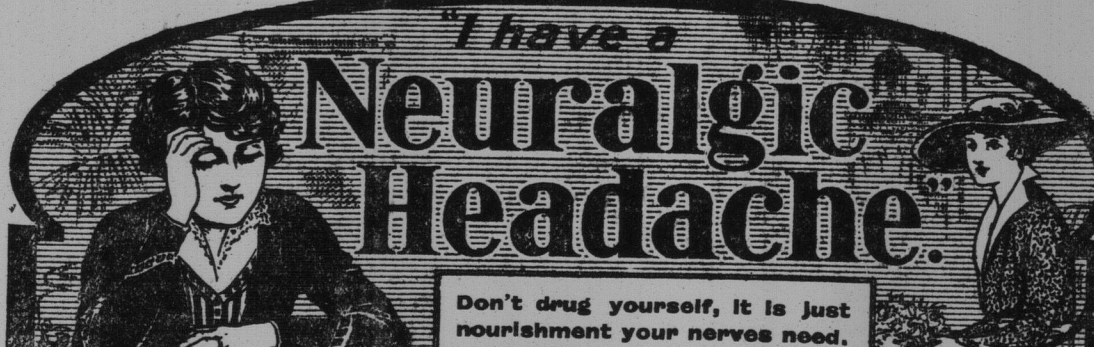

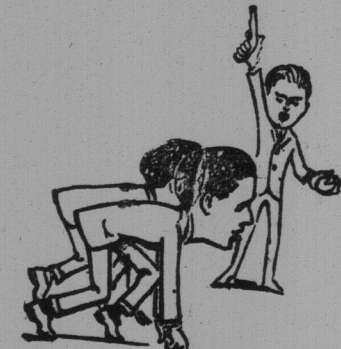

## Ingenuity at the Hospital

A remarkable instance of the efficiency of the Army Medical Service is the case of Sergeant J. Leaver, of the Buffs, now in hospital at Southend, Eng. He sustained wounds which practically shattered his left hip-bone and hip, and for some time his life was in danger, when the loss of his leg was considered, while he was being treated under the plan of the hospital.

When brought to the hospital Leaver was in so serious a condition that he could not even be turned over to admit of his wounds being dressed, but the ingenuity of the hospital medical staff was equal to the occasion. A mattress specially constructed in sections was placed on his bed, and his injuries were dressed from underneath, the por-
