





Replacing milk in stores, milk unsold fro mteams that is returned to the dairy, is only valued at present selling price of butter, three cents per quart. The pasteurizing plants cannot estimate from day to day their requirements, and have during the fush season averaged some 200 gallons of milk weekly that is termed surplus milk. The farmer is paid the full price for this milk and the dairy has to stand the loss. This surplus




