### Money In Sheep

#### Special Massachusetts Commission to Visit the Kendall Farms in Bowdoinham for Inspiration in Building up the Sheep Industry

This week the Massachusetts "Special Commission on Sheep Industry, Agriculture and Related Matters" will visit the famous sheep farms of William B. Kendall in Bowdoinham, Maine. This is one of the steps which Massachusetts is taking today for the promotion of the sheep industry as a means of increasing the supply of wool and mutton for help in winning the war, for the renovation of worn and abandoned farms and for the increase of ready money in the pockets of the men who have the courage and the foresight to engage in the sheep business. There was much agitation during the last session of the legislature. The state board of agriculture backed up the sheep enthusiasts in trying to get legislation through for the protection of sheep from dogs. A commission of the year before brought in a draft of a bill to remedy the evil, but the dogs have since then been so numerous that the sheep had to be guarded by men, though many of the people as little as possible, failed. There a further effort resulted in the creation of the commission mentioned above, to study the subject and report to the legislature. Secretary Wilfred Wheeler of the state board of agriculture is the real author of the bill, because of his long experience about the great enterprise of Mr. Kendall. Perhaps it seems larger to people outside of the state than it really is. Mr. Kendall makes it out to be an enterprise of national importance. He has been in the eastern states.
