Copenhagen, Oct. 29.—King Christian and
Queen Alexandra recently witnessed a
review of boy and girl Scouts, among
which were the Crown Prince Frederik and
his younger brother, Prince Knud. His
Majesty after having expressed his satis-
faction with the drill, made a speech, in
which he said: "The Queen and I have fol-
lowed the scout movement from the very
beginning with the greatest interest, and
we have, therefore, done as I am glad to
say, have many other Danish parents: we
have surrendered our two boys." After
the review the king invited the scouts
—700 in all—to the royal castle, Sans
Souci, where chocolate and cakes were
served for them.
