"And you won't hear them if you do that," the writer declared. Snodgrass appeared to think this advice unnecessary.


"I won't hear them; you may be sure of that," he said.

BENDER WON MOST GAMES IN SEASON

The laurel for highest percentage of games won for the season in the major eagues goes to Bender of the Athletics. Though headed by nominally higher rank-

Though headed by nominally higher ranking men, but playing in only a few games, the Indian finished the American league season with an average of 713, leading the best performer in the National circuit, Crandall of New York, Coombs of the Athletics, are the runners-up in the American league, Marquard of New York, and Alexander of the Phillies holding similar rank in the other league.

The record of strike-outs—313—held of Walter Johnson of Washington, was never threatened, Walsh of the Chicago White Sox heading both leagues with 255. Wood of Boston being a good second with 233. Marquard leads the Nationals with 235. Alexander following with 228, Marquard holds the best record for the majors in single strike-outs, 14, made twice during the season. Wood of Boston was next with 13, which is the season's record for the American league. Several American leaguers registered 12 in a single game, among whom was O'Brien, the recruit of the Red Sox.

In the matter of bases on balls Harmon of the Cardinals was the most producal, handing out 180, while in the American league, Krapp of Cleveland, dispensed his bounty to the number of 134. In hitting batsmen Morgan of Philadelphia topped the list, with 23 scratches against his name. Leifield of the Pirates leads the National league with only 16. Johnson of Washington had the most wild pitches charged up. 17. Camnitz of Pittsburg, helding the older league's lead with 11.

London, Oct. 25-The enormous exper ture that a war between two Great European Powers would entail can be seen from the following details of the cost of the Franco-German war of 1870, which appears in the current issue of the "Army and Navy Gazette:"

"The cost from July 17, 1870, to the eighteenth of the following May, on which day the Treaty of Frankfort was ratified, was 1,912,000,000 francs, or about \$385,-000,000, this being for war charges, proper-
