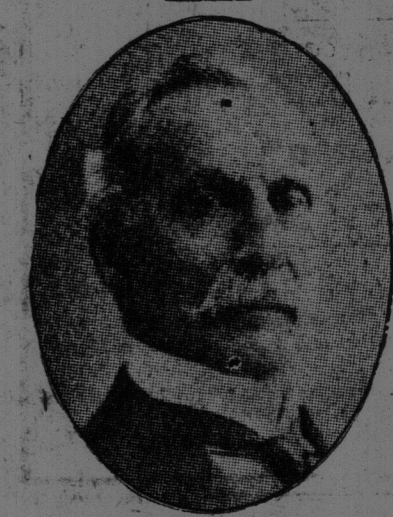
Advice for Snodgrass.
