# POLICE CHECK

New York Police Report on Fruitful Cause of Auto Accidents - Traffic Mishaps Decrease.

New York, Feb. 18-A decrease in

Bureau of Public Safety of the Police Department began to function, secording to reports announced by Special Deputy Police Commissioner Barren G. Collier at a meeting of the Traffic Commission at the offices of Chief Magistrate William McAdoo, chairman of the committee. Magistrate McAdoo announced that a hearing on traffic matters would be held Monday afternoon at two o'clock in the Board of Estimate Chamber at City Hall.

Fourteen police lieutenants during January checked more than 6,000 violations of traffic ordinance by persons walking in the streets as well as other violations by drivers of motor vehicles. The reports show that the Safety Bureau caught 3,000 "jay walkers" or persons crossing streets in the middle of the block and 2,722 persons crossing the street diagonally, also 500 children stealing rides or "hitching on" behind moving vehicles. 

About two o'clock in the afternoon the Queen of the Belgians, the Crown Frince and Field Marshal Viscount and Lady Allenby were conducted into the tomb by Howard Carter.


