The letter from Mr. Cancino, a pineaple and sisal planter on the Island of Eleuthera, one of the Bahamas, is very informative as to the present condition of those islands commercially, and reveals an enthusiastic desire for union with Canada. The islands are at present shut out from the United States markets by high duties. Should reciprocity be adopted they would, as part of Canada, be free of the United States market for the greater part of their products. This is a prospective feature of the change which has not occurred to our correspondent, who seems to place his hopes of trade regeneration in free commerce with what would in case of union be the rest of Canada. the last few weeks, the object of such bit ter attacks in the German newspapers owing to his remarks criticising Geranany's Moorish policy made in a convectation with an Austrian journalist, Dr. Siegranud Munz, and published by the latter in the Vienna "Neue Freie Presse," is persona grata at the court of Emperor Francis Joseph, and in Viennes society.

He has a very strong virain of German holood in his veins. Sir Fairfax's own mother was also a German, Fraulein Clementine Gaul, who had been risk companion of the first wife of his father, William Corawallis Cartwright, of Aynho, Banbury.

The Cartwright, a successful lawyse, who bought the property early in the syventeenth century, and whose son married the daughter of the famous parliamentary general, the second Lord Fairfax, who commanded at Marstom Moor. It is from this general that Sir Fairfax derives his Christian name.

When he was in Rome he married the youngest daughter of the Marchese Chigit, a member of that historic and princely house of the old Roman patriciate and the head of which is hereditary marshal of the Holy Roman church and guardian of the H
