## Newfoundland Legislature. COUNCIL CHAMBER.

ST. JOHN'S, TUESDAY, FEB. 17.

The hon, the SPEAKER moved for leave to Vacation, on Monday the 13th of January, bring in a Bill for removing doubts respecting the introduction of the Law of England into Newfoundland. The hon, gentleman Instruction in Reading, Writing, Arithmetic, had two objects in view which he was anxious to see accomplished by the passage of Ditto, with Geography Mapping, History, this bill—the one was to fix some period at which the Law of England should be regarded as in force in Newfoundland, and the other was to introduce the several improvements which had of late years been made in the law by the British parliament. In his opinion the Law of England generally as it stood at the passage of the 5, Geo. IV., constituting the Supreme Court, so far as it could be enforced in Newfoundland, already constituted the law of the Island; MRS. GILMOUR begs to intimate but inasmuch as doubts had been entertained upon that subject he thought it desirable, establishment of a local legislature, that the subject should be placed upon such a footing as would, at all events, be permanent and fixed, as nothing could be more preju-PLANKS of every description for sale dicial or inconvenient than a change of opinion in the Supreme Court of any country as to what laws they might be called upon
