My pride would not permit me to do so, but now I have decided to give my sacred promise to abide by the medical code of ethics as promulgated by the Ontario Medical Council, and will not again offend in advertising or in any way. Intending to take up land in Manitoba it would not be so much matter to myself as I am upwards of sixty and not much of a career left, but on account of my nearly heart broken wife and young family, whose future would be clouded, I have decided to ask pardon and forgiveness, in the hope that my name may not be erased, my promise accepted. I have one son entered on business a year ago, two sons of eight and ten years, and one daughter at the Bishop Strachan School, who would be obliged to retire, and the future of all be clouded forever by this misfortune. I hope, therefore, you will see your way, as President, to do all you can for me, so as to avoid my erasure from the Register, particularly as there is no precedent in my form of case, or it may be to postpone?
