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(Hamilton, Ont., Spectator.) There are not many Russian soldiers in Hamilton, but every time it snows we have a General Shoveloff.

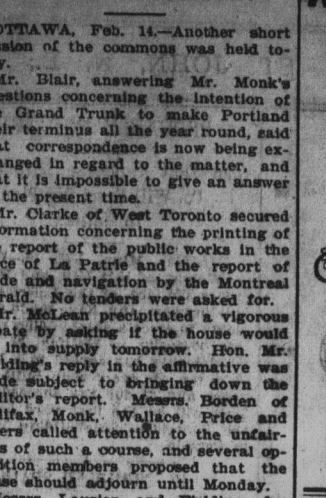
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C. OF E. INSTITUTE.
