MAXIM URGES NEED

OF BRITISH AIRSHIPS

Says Government Should Set Aside \$500,-

000 for Experiments.

LONDON, Aug. 5—Sir Hiram Maxim declares that in order to keep pace with its continental competitors Great Britain should set aside a sum of \$500,-000 for experiments in the construction of airships. If this were done, he says, Great Britain would, at the end of three years, be in possession of half a dozen flying machines.

"France and Germany," he said to a reported at his Thurlow Park home yesterday, "are a long way ahead of us already. They have a great deal to do yet before their experiments are a complete success, but they are sparing neither time nor money, and they have made a corresponding degree of improvement."

Sir Hiram Maxim has devoted wenty years to the study of aerial avigation, and is about to produce a ook embodying the result of his in-

so confident is he of the feasibility of aerial navigation from the practical point of view that he makes, through the Express, an offer to accept a contract from the British Government tomorrow to build, within three years, half a dozen or a dozen fast flying
