Tantramar Town Wants Post Office and Customs House - Was Shulee Fire Work of Incendiary?

Sackville, July 19. - A W. M. S. convention for Sackville district was held at Bale Verte on Tuesday last, which was well attended by members of that organization. The district includes the auxiliaries at Sackville, Upper Sackville, Dorchester, Bale Verte, Port Elgin, Jolicoeur, Point de Bute, Bayfield and Upper Cape.

A new fish factory is to be erected at Tintinab, where herring will be smoked and packed for the Canadian market. W. Layton, of Grand Manan, will be the manager. The erection of the buildings will be begun at once.

Changes in the Bank of Nova Scotia staff has taken place on Tuesday of S. C. Munro, the accountant, to St. John, and the appointment of Thomas Milton, late of the Jacques River branch, to succeed him here.

Another marriage of interest recently was that of Miss Lucy Dool, only daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Wesley Dool, Sackville, to Fred Kerrihan, of Girvin, Sask. The ceremony was performed in Metropolitan Methodist church, Regina, by Rev. H. Lewis.

The business men of the town will hold a merchants' day on Wednesday next. Low prices on merchandise will prevail and intending buyers will travel at much reduced rates on the N. B. and P. E. I. line of railway.

The need of increased and up-to-date hotel accommodation has been felt at Sackville for some time past, owing to the heat this season, available boarding houses are overtaxed. A number of Sackville men have decided on the erection of a new hotel at an early date.

The extensive forest fires which have been raging for the past week in the vicinity of River Hebert and Shulee are credited by those most interested to be the work of an incendiary. Over a hundred square miles have been swept including much valuable timber land.

THE FENIAN RAID CLAIMS

Records on which Veterans of Fenian Raids Base their Claims for Government Recognition-Land Grants Asked. (Halifax Herald.) By the following extract from an Ottawa paper it would seem that veterans of the Fenian raid of 1866 in the western provinces of the Dominion are fully alive and alert as to the justice of their claims following on the receipt of the grants to veterans of the South African struggle.

The long talk of attack on the important strategic point of Halifax, the experiences at Campobello and St. John's, entirely discouraging their leaders. Six weeks later, however, the Fenians actually did invade Canada, the principal rendezvous being Buffalo, where the U. S. authorities, in a pre-emptive action with the promptitude of General Meade at Eastport, and as a result, the Canadian residents, whose raid took place, suffered grievous destruction of property; a lamentable list of dead and wounded also occurring before the Fenians were ousted across the border.

When the Fenian troubles broke out in 1866 the Fenian leaders once more looked their venom towards Canada, but their efforts were futile. A meeting with derision and contempt. Our coming governor general, the Duke of Cornwall, was on active militia service during the 1870 campaigns.

CLOSING STOCK LETTER. By direct private wires to J. C. Macintosh & Co. New York, July 20. - The developments in the money situation as given in the morning papers were a pretext to sell at the opening, not only trust stocks but the general list as well. It was rather incomprehensible why these departments should affect the entire list when local securities were the only ones interested, possibly the liquidation started yesterday had not been completed. However, the decline was of short duration as in about an hour's time there was less interest shown in transit and attention was diverted to the important issues, a stronger tone being displayed for the market. The strong letter from the Mayor commending the proposals from the transit companies as being inimical to the city's interests, combined with the attack on the corporations altered the situation enough to have the decided effect in the way of preventing the Interborough from getting the franchises as the vote shows.
