ENGLAND—NATION OF SWIMMERS SINCE CAPT. WEBB SWAM CHANNEL

Now Everyone Wants to Go Swimming—The Great feat of Burgess Will, No Doubt, Cause a Great Increase in the Number of Expert Swimmers.

Since Capt. Webb swam the Channel in 1876 England has become a nation of swimmers. Everybody feels that it is incumbent upon him at least to learn to swim. Most girls look upon swimming as an accomplishment well within their reach, given the necessary time, instruction, and opportunity. The great and permanent value of Capt. Webb's wonderful feat lay in the encouragement it gave to swimming, and the splendid achievement of Mr. Burgess will have an equally stimulating effect upon the progress of a very necessary, useful and health-giving physical exercise.

I first met William Burgess in 1900 at the Olympic games at Paris where he represented France in the races against the swimmers of England, Germany, Holland, Belgium and Hungary. He then struck me as a man who would not attempt a great task unless he was prepared for it. He has since taken part in many long distance events in the Seine, his best effort being when he covered nearly 28 miles in 24 hours, thereby beating such well known long distance swimmers as Hobbs of England; Paulus and Bourgois, of France, and Cattalin of Italy. Each of his attempts to swim the Channel showed that he had the necessary stamina for the task, and I am extremely glad that he has now achieved the object of his life, although not in such fast time as Capt. Webb, who swam the channel in 21 hours 45 minutes.

Captain Webb's Example. Capt. Webb's great swim revolutionized the art of swimming in Great Britain. Before 1875 swimming was regarded as a feat of arms, a feat of moment. Very few schools taught their boys to swim, and most of those who did learn looked upon it as a bath as the maximum distance they could hope to attain. Gradually it was realized that long distance swimming was a necessary part of a boy's training, and as years went by a new race of long distance swimmers was created. Today we have plenty of long distance swimming races in the United Kingdom, the chief being the 15 mile swim through London from Richmond to Blackfriars organized by the Weekly Dispatch Swimming Club. The swim through Paris is evidence of the interest taken in the art in France, and similar contests are quite common among the swimmers of the riverside cities of Germany.

I trace to the example of Capt. Webb and the encouragement of similar attempts to swim the Channel the great growth of swimming in England. Many education authorities now regard swimming as a necessary part of a boy's training, and of our crowd of growing generation that is now being trained, there is no better exercise, and it is cheap in practice, valuable in its normal and physical effects and suitable for both boys and girls.

Schoolboy Champions. Secondary schools are everywhere following the lead of the elementary schools. In many instances they showed the way. I believe the time will soon come when no school will be regarded as completely equipped unless it teaches its pupils how to swim and how to save life in the water. Farnhamham is the champion swimming and life-saving school of the country. It has its own bath in which every boy is taught to swim, with the result that the school has earned nearly 1,200 awards for knowledge of life-saving and boys who

REVIVAL AT NORTON PROVING A SUCCESS

Intense Interest is Being Taken in the Services and Many Conversions Have Been Reported.

Norton, Oct. 20.—It is almost impossible to give an adequate description of the intense interest throughout the entire surrounding country in the present revival. During the past three weeks these meetings have been in progress scores of people have made definite decisions for Christ, and among them the most prominent citizens of Norton, as well as from adjoining towns. The influence of the work has reached several homes in St. John and other cities.

On Sabbath morning Rev. Mr. Moses pastor of the Reformed Baptist church, conducted the service and after a short address, many of the young converts rose to their feet and witnessed to the power of God in their souls. At three o'clock Rev. C. P. Goodson, of New York who is leading the pastors and people in this movement, came to the service with his usual earnestness, and spoke out of a full heart on "Salvation sought and missed." Impelled by his urgent appeal many went forward and professed to accept Christ as their Savior. In the evening the large temperance hall, which had been packed at the afternoon service, was crowded to the doors a half hour before the time for the service. Mr. Goodson preached on "The secret of great achievement," from the text "But they that do know their God, shall be strong and do exploits." He contended that the supreme factor in character is worthy living, in incentives to noble effort and as a secret source of power, in God. He showed history and current illustration how the great men in all walks of life, are men who know their God. His preaching is void of all sensationalism. He is not a professional evangelist, but having been a pastor for several years, he preaches the gospel of his Christ, and not for fire for souls. At this service, as at all these were decisions for Christ.

On Friday night, Mr. Goodson, presented copies of his gospel of St. John, to all the young boys and girls, who form the Goodson's choir, an organization which supplements the great choir, and whose singing has been a special feature of the meetings. These gospels were furnished by Mrs. E. C. Miller, of New York. More than a hundred were given away. On Tuesday night Mr. Goodson has promised to give a copy to all those who have accepted Christ during these meetings.

The revival will continue through the week, and on Sunday, Mr. Goodson, preaching through illness, at three o'clock, and at 7 o'clock. The bars are spending a few days at the old home. Mrs. James Stephens is in poor health. Miss Cora Farris who has been sick is slowly recovering.
