ROYAL NAVAL COLLEGE OF CANADA, HALIFAX, N. S.
The next examination for the entry of Naval Cadets will be held at the examination centre of the Civil Service Commission in November 1912; parents or guardians of intending candidates should apply to the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, Ottawa, for entry papers before 1st October next. SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.
Any person who is the owner of a family or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister, or in certain districts a homesteader in good standing may present a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.
