LOOKING FOR DERELICT.

The revenue cutter Gresham left Boston Thursday night in search of a derelict vessel which was reported seen in the vicinity of Thatcher's Island on Wednesday. The cutter went out prepared to blow up the wreck if it was found impracticable to tow her into port.

BOTTOM PLATES DAMAGED.

His Majesty's ship, the United States, was docked at Barry recently with several bottom plates damaged.

WILL BE SURVEYED.

Havana, July 3.—Str Furter, from Philadelphia, arrived after being ashore in Providence Channel; will be surveyed.

HAD BEEN ON FIRE.

London, July 5.—On arrival at Plymouth yesterday of Str Furest Bismarck (Ger) from Mexico and Cuba, it was reported that for three days there had been a fire on the ship; the trouble was confined to the forehold, where 8,000 bags of coffee were stored; this was all damaged, the hold being flooded to extinguish the flames; the water was pumped out at Plymouth.

FROM WEST INDIES.

The steamer Rhodesian arrived in port yesterday morning from the West Indies with a cargo for this port and Halifax.

WAS DISMASTED.

Pernambuco, July 9.—Bark Oceano (Port) from Lisbon for Bahia, arrived in tow of Str Valeria (Ger) from Montevideo for Hamburg; the bark was partially dismasted in gale.

DANGERS TO NAVIGATION.

Str Barbarossa (Ger) from Genoa, etc., reports July 10 in communication with Str Princess Irene (Ger), from New York for Naples, which stated that on July 8, in lat 39 50, lon 52 55, passed a schooner bottom up.

Str Thonis (Nor) reports July 10, in lat 48 07, lon 54 05, W, passed a heavy spar about 50 feet in length and 3 feet in diameter.

Str Canopic reports July 5, in lat 38 04, lon 7 09, W, passed two red buoys marked M surrounded by iron staffs with a square red flag with a black ball in the center.

Str Manchester inventor reports July 6, in lat 49 06, lon 48 10, W, saw a large iceberg with two high peaks; lat 42 45, lon 49 28, W, a large, high berg; 7th, lat 48 45, lon 49 39, W, to lat 48 55, lon 49 45, W, four large bergs and three growlers.

STILWELL SMILES AS HE ENTERS SING SING



Stephen J. Stilwell, twice a Senator and now a convict, smiled and chatted as he was taken to Sing Sing prison to serve not less than four nor more than eight years for bribery while chairman of the Codes Committee of the New York State Senate. In the first statement he has made to the public since his indictment he declared that he was innocent of the crime and added that he had made no confession implicating other legislators in graft practice at Albany. The haste of his lawyers to go to the Tombs as soon as District Attorney Whitman ended the delay in going to Sing Sing granted to Stilwell seemed to explain the note to the public sent from his Tombs cell soon after his legal advisers arrived there. It said: "I wish to deny the persistent rumors and statements that I was about to make a confession. I am entirely innocent, and, therefore, have no confession to make."

CANADA NOW IMPORTING HER BUTTER

First Time in Sixty Years Shipped Now to United Kingdom.

GROWTH OF THE HOME MARKET THE CAUSE.

Dairying Industry not Declining, but People are Using more Milk and Cream per capita.

Special to The Standard. Ottawa, July 19.—According to statistics just prepared during the past year for the first time in over sixty years, Canada shipped no butter to the United Kingdom. Canada is now on the other hand classed among the butter importing countries, as during the past fiscal year there was an enormous increase and the butter imports reached a total of some 7,000,000 lbs., mostly from New Zealand.

The dairy branch of the agricultural department claims that the decline in Canada's export butter trade and the increase in the imports of butter do not indicate any decline in the dairy industry. The growth of the home market is given as the principal cause for the change in the situation.

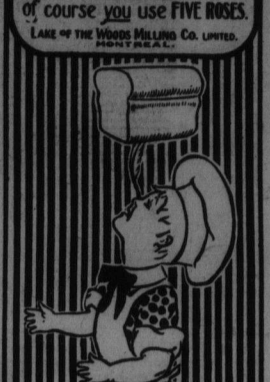
