MUNICIPALITIES TO WATCH FREDERICTON

Union of New Brunswick Municipalities Represented at Fredericton Today to Look After Bills Before the Legislature.

Commissioner McLellan left last night for Fredericton to attend a meeting of the legislative committee of the Union of New Brunswick Municipalities, which will be held this morning in City Hall there. They will consider all the bills coming before the legislature which affect the municipalities, and are prepared to head off adverse legislation, or help the passage of any which they consider in the interests of the municipalities.

One St. John bill which is expected to come in for considerable criticism is that relating to the General Public Hospital, giving power to collect from the various counties for the care and maintenance of patients from the municipality, and giving the counties power to collect from the patient, provided he is able to pay. The commissioner thought most of the opposition was due to misconception, and when the bill was explained in the legislative committee of the Union, most of it would be withdrawn.

The city bills will be before the legislature on Thursday, and it is expected that all the city fathers will be on hand to see that they get safely through.

EARLY MARRIAGES ARE SUPPORTED AND OPPOSED

war. The whole tendency of the times was to facilitate and encourage marriage.

Not a Gretia Green.

Mr. Smith (Charlotte) denied that his county was the Gretia Green of the province. He had heard no complaints of people coming into Charlotte to get married and evade the laws.

The only effect the section would have would be to divert fees from poorly paid clergymen in New Brunswick to poorly paid clergymen in Maine.

Hon. Mr. Foster said he was responsible for the clause of the bill requiring fifteen days' residence in the province. He had received many complaints from Charlotte in regard to clandestine marriages and the clause was based upon those complaints.

Personally he had no objection to the clause being struck out.

Hon. Mr. Robinson said it did seem that the proposed amendment might create hardship and he was glad that there had been a frank expression of opinion in regard to it.

Mr. McGrath said he strongly disapproved of the proposed section which would make legitimate children born before the marriage of their parents.

Hon. Mr. Sweeney was in favor of reasonable restrictions being put upon the facilities for obtaining a marriage license, and he thought that the requirement of fifteen days' residence was quite proper.

He had no sympathy with making it too easy for young people to get married as experience showed that half the troubles which were aired in the country, and particularly in the courts, arose from hasty ill-considered marriages.

Hon. Mr. Baxter.

Hon. Mr. Baxter said there were two reasons why publication of intention to get married were necessary, one was to prevent young people under age getting married without their parents' consent, and the other was to prevent bigamy. The mischief of the matter is that someone is certain to break the law, unwillingly.

Personally he would prefer to withdraw the amendment, but if it was the government's policy to let it remain he would not oppose it.

Ultimately progress was reported in order that some of these points might be discussed by the legal members.

Evening Session.

The committee resumed at 8.15. Mr. Menzies in the chair, and agreed to the bills respecting public streets in the city of St. John and to amend the incorporation act of the town of Sussex.

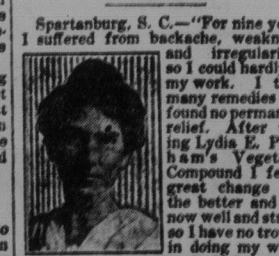
The House again went into committee with Mr. Robichaud in the chair and agreed to the bill to authorize the town of Edmundston to issue sewerage debentures and also to the bill to amend the town's incorporation act insofar as it applied to the town of Edmundston.

Mr. Baxter asked leave to dispense with notice of motion to suspend the rules of the House in favor of a bill to amend the rates and taxes act in order that the same might be considered with the other St. John bills.

The House adjourned at 9.20 p. m.
