ERNEST HUTCHINSON DEAD AFTER VERY BRIEF ILLNESS

Well Known Lumber Merchant Passes Away in South Carolina, While His Wife Was in St. John on Her Way to Join Him—One of New Brunswick's Foremost Business Men, Interested in All Public Affairs—Formerly in Politics and Generous in the Promotion of All Good Works.

Newcastle, Dec. 5.—Miramichi lost a most distinguished and respected business man and citizen in the death at Columbia, South Carolina, today, of Ernest Hutchinson, of Douglastown, deceased, who was a retired lumber operator, was seventy-one years old.

He was never a strong party man, but always worked for what he thought best for the country at the time. When Northumberland County was incorporated in 1874, Mr. Hutchinson was elected county councillor for Newcastle parish, and became the first warden.
