Want Dutch Sugar Standard In Canada

The Board of Trade has been advised that Messrs. Reid of Demerara, Forthoun of Grenada, Phillips of Barbados and McDonald of Antigua, delegates to the Ottawa conference, will arrive here on May 24. The Jamaica and Bermuda delegates appear to have gone via New York.

While definite information as to the programme and purpose of the West Indian delegation has not been received here, a member of the Board said yesterday that the question of increased reciprocity between Canada and the West Indies would be one of the principal matters considered. At the meeting of the Associated Chambers of Commerce of the British West Indies held recently in Barbados a resolution was unanimously adopted recording the appreciation of the benefits which have accrued to the West Indies from the reciprocity arrangement with Canada and expressing belief in the desirability of a reciprocal increase in the amount of the existing preference.

Another matter the West Indian delegates will bring up is the application of the Dutch Standard of grading sugar for customs purposes in Canada. The opinion is strongly held in the West Indies that the present method of grading sugar in Canada for duty purposes is detrimental to the interests of the West Indian sugar industry, and has proved an irritating obstruction to trade. It is said that the West Indian delegation is instructed to urge upon the Canadian Government the expediency of collecting the duty by the polariscope test only, without regard to color.
