

THE GYMNASIUM. This building was completed in January of 1896. It is 60x32 feet, two stories, with gallery, and is composed of brick and Trenton limestone. The basement is fitted up as an Armory, and also contains Shower Baths, Lavatory, with water closets, and every modern convenience. The main floor is used as the Gymnasium proper, and has a gallery running the entire length of the building. It has a 20-foot ceiling, and is thoroughly fitted with all the latest apparatus, including Basket Ball, Parallel Bars, Vaulting Horse, Travelling Rings, Flying Rings, Horizontal Bar, Ladders, Chest Weights, etc., etc., in fact everything to be found in the largest and best Gymnasium. The young ladies, as well as young men, have the use of the Gymnasium at regular assigned hours, and under a competent instructor.
