Leaves an Estate Valued at

London, June 30—The will of Field Marshall Earl Kitchener. the British Secretary of War, who lost his life in sinking of the Hampshire off Orkneys. June 5, was admitted to robate to day. It shows that he left an estate valued at 171, 420 pounds sterling (approximately \$850,000.)

The largest bequests were the sum of £20,000 to his nephew, Henry Hamilon Kitchener and the Broome Park estate and all lands in Kent County to his nephew, Commander Henry Franklyn Chevallier Kitchener of the Royal Navy, and son of the new Earl.

The will makes a number of smaller bequests to relatives and friends including £200 each to several officers, who served on Lord Kitchener's personal staff.

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
