Uplands, Ontario	19 January 1944		Cloudy, hazy, patches of fog.	
	20 January 1944		Overcast, intermittent snow. No flying, due to the very poor weather.	
	21 January 1944		Overcast, snow. No flying again today. The Commanding Officer was promoted to the rank of Group Captain today. The Friday night dance in the Rec. Hall was well attended.	
	22 January 1944		Mostly overcast. A full day's flying.	
	23 January 1944		Low clouds and snow. Flying washed out early in the day. The last Divine Services to be held in the Recreation Hall were held today.	
	24 January 1944		Partly cloudy to cloudy. The Commanding Officer, Group Captain J.G. Stephenson, celebrated his promotion tonight in the Officers' Mess.	
	25 January 1944		Overcast. Snow and freezing rain. The Sergeants' Mess was tonight's venue of the promotion celebration for the Commanding Officer.	
	26 January 1944		Snow. Flying washed out. The Wings Dinner for Course 89 took place in the Officers' Mess followed by a Wings Dance in the Rec. Hall.	
	27 January 1944		Fog at first, overcast. Flying for part of the day only.	
28 January 1944		Cloudy becoming overcast. A combined Wings Parade and presentation of Operational Wings was held today. Air Commodore A. Raymond, Air Officer Commanding No. 3 Training Command, and former Commanding Officer of this Unit, presented the gold Operational Wings to six Officers from this Station - S/L D.G. Malloy, DFC, F/L R.D. Church, DFC, F/L H.L. Coons, DFC, F/O W.J. Buzza, F/O K.B. Handley and F/O K.H. Owens, DFC, - after which the A.O.C. pinned
