Dear Senator:-

This will acknowledge receipt of yours of the 1st which I find awaiting me on my return from Toronto, having been two weeks there on an arbitration matter.

Senator White had written to me asking me to see you when in Toronto but it was absolutely impossible as we did not get through until eight o'clock Saturday night and in order to do so we did not adjourn for dinner.

I have received from our Tax Collector the amount outstanding on Gerald's property, \$602.03 past due, and the last instalment for this year's taxes due the 1st of December is \$147.92. There must have been more than a year's taxes behind and, as Gerald says, these taxes must be paid, especially in view of a Mortgage being on the property.

You ask me to let you know whether I think it is really worth while to see that these taxes are paid. All I can say to that is that unless Gerald gets down to living within his income it is only putting off the evil day. But he has been through such a strain now and the worry that he has had, for I don't think any person can realize it, that it may be that he will now realize that he must live within his income, and there is no reason why he should not. He may have to cut out the frills such as Club fees, etc, and I am going to have a talk with him about it. Unfortunately for Gerald he was brought up with a silver spoon in his mouth and has not any idea of living on his income. He goes along never making provision for what is to come, spending the money when he has it on whatever whim or fancy he may ~~have~~ desire.
