Dear Mr. Swartman:

X-Ray Survey - Sioux Lookout Agency

I note in your report on 1953 Annuity Payments, dated Feb. 15, 1954, your remarks regarding the x-ray survey. I cannot agree with your remarks where you propose that the x-ray party try to meet the Indians at some date other than that of the Treaty Party.

By a copy of this letter I am instructing Doctor Wood and Doctor Millar to give you full co-operation and to recognize the fact that you are the senior official in charge of the party.

I think your comment regarding making the x-ray machine and motor generator more portable by welding in rings so that poles could be inserted to assist in carrying the x-ray machine and generator, should be acted upon and I hope you will discuss this with Doctor Millar. It might even be possible to get a lighter generator. Doctor Wood could investigate this.

I have not seen your proposed itinerary, but as far as Indian Health Services are concerned, we would favour the use of Central Airways' equipment.

I am sending copies of this letter to Doctor Millar, Doctor Wood, and to the Director of the Indian Affairs Branch.
