With Cheque

September 15th, 1919.

Sir,-

The Department has received your letter of the 9th instant, with which you returned official cheque No. 1202 for \$21.50 issued in favor of the Kelowna Hospital Society; and in reply I beg to say that the reason for the cheque having been drawn for the amount stated is that the charge for maintenance of Donald Jack in the said hospital was reduced from \$2.00 to \$1.50 a day, at which rate it is usual to make payment for care of patients in hospitals. Thirteen days' maintenance at \$1.50 amounts to \$19.50. The charge of \$2.00 for operation was allowed, and the cheque was drawn for \$21.50. The said cheque is returned herewith, and it is hoped that the hospital will see its way to accept the same in settlement of their account.
