WHEREAS the Government of the Province of British Columbia has made application to the Department of Mines and Resources to purchase two parcels of land in Kopchitchin Indian Reserve No. 2 of the Boston Bar Band in the said Province, required for road purposes;

AND WHEREAS the said land has been valued at Three Hundred and Sixty dollars (\$360.00) by an officer of the Department of Mines and Resources, which sum has been remitted in full payment thereof;

THEREFORE His Excellency the Governor General in Council, on the recommendation of the Minister of Mines and Resources, is pleased to order that the lands described herein be and they are hereby transferred to His Majesty in the right of British Columbia, as represented by the Minister of Public Works, in accordance with the provisions of Section 48 of the Indian Act, Chapter 98, R.S. 1927.

DESCRIPTION

Those two parcels of land lying on either side of the Canadian Pacific Railway in Kopchitchin Indian Reserve No. 2 of the Boston Bar Band, Province of British Columbia, required as a right of way for a road, and containing one acre and seventy-two hundredths of an acre, more or less, for the parcel west of the said railway, and three acres and eight hundredths of an acre, more or less, for the parcel east of the said railway, as the said parcels are shown coloured pink upon a plan of the said right of way signed by C.B.N. Wilkie, British Columbia Land Surveyor, on the 4th day of July, 1940, that was filed in the Land Registry Office of the District under No. A889 on the 23rd day of October, 1940, a duplicate of which is of record number H4-2917 in the Indian Affairs survey records, Department of Mines and Resources, Ottawa.
