This will make it pssible for Canadians to visit the United States without having imposed upon them an undue financial burden.

If the Canadian Government should find it necessary to impose passport and visa requirements upon citizens of the United States visiting Canada, the Canadian Government strongly urges that the Government of the United States consider the possibility of substituting for its present expensive passport a travel document of a somewhat similar character, which would prove a less formidable barrier to citizens of the United States of moderate means who may wish to visit Canada. This would assist in attaining the end which both Governments desire, and which is mentioned in your note - that the freedom of movement across the border continue with as little inconvenience as possible.
