---THE WITNESS WITHDRAWS.

2nd Witness for THE PROSECUTION Lieutenant W.A. LINDSEY, R.W.M., No 23 Canadian Infantry (Basic) Training Centre, C.I., being duly sworn is examined by the Prosecutor:-

- Q Mr. Lindsey, where are you stationed ?
- A I am stationed at No 23 C.I. (B) T.C., Newmarket, Ontario.
- Q What are your duties here ?
- A I am Assistant Adjutant of this Centre, and as such I have charge of the Regimental books and documents.
- Q Do you know the accused ?
- A I do.
- Q What is his name ?
- A Private Galver.
- Q Have you any evidence to offer the Court relative to the charge against the accused ?
- A I have R.F.M. 215 certificate of apprehension by Service authorities dated at Kingston, Ontario on the 5th of March, 1945, and signed by E. Joyce, Captain, C.C. No 1 Detachment, No 13 Company, Canadian Provost Corps, Kingston, Ontario; and it refers to the accused here present in Court, Private Galver.
- Q Present that document to the Court, please.
