

Q Are there any houses there?

A There is one house that they use when they go there to fish.

Q How many acres do you think they should have there?

A (Examining tabulation) I say five acres.

Q Now Application No. 4?

A That is a fishing station - they get seekeys and humpbacks there - the Lowe Inlet Camery had a fishing license there.

Q Does that interfere with their fishing there at all?

A It interferes with their fishing for commercial purposes.

Q Have they fished there for food as far back as you can remember?

A Yes.

Q Did you identify the place on the ground?

A Yes, I was there and surveyed the land personally and took photographs of it.

Q Can you point it out on the map?

A (Examining map) It is at the head of a lagoon (marked No. 4 on blue-print).

Q How many acres do you recommend?

A I recommend ten acres there.

Q Why do you change the application from five acres to ten acres?

A Because it satisfied the Indians better - as far as the land goes it is immaterial, but the Indians say that five acres is not enough.

Q How many houses are there there?

A There are three houses there.

Q So that it is a large and important fishing station there?

A Yes.

Q And you recommend ten acres there?

A Yes.

MR COMMISSIONER SHAW: Would the giving of ten acres on this application or at this point interfere with any white interests there?

A Not to my knowledge - it would depend very much upon how this ten acres was laid out.

Q Would the three houses come within the radius of the five acres?

A Yes.

Q What use would the additional five acres be?
