

The record of Shorthorn sales this year is one that has not been equalled in the history of the breed, taking into consideration the large number of sales which have taken place during that period. It is true in the seventies some few higher prices and higher averages were made, but these were very much more limited in number. The top place in the average list is occupied by Mr. Duthie, at whose sale eighteen bull calves made the notable average of £304 15s. per head, with the top price of 850 gs. Closely following this comes the average sale of the late Mr. P. L. Mills' herd, at which one yearling and fifteen head realized £155 19s. 5d., the low prices, were 1,100 gs. for a bull, and 600 gs. for females.
