Voted, That the Sum of *Sixty Pounds* be paid to *John Duport*, Esq; as a further Consideration for his Services in preparing a new Edition of the Laws of the Province, and correcting the Press with the same.

Agreed, that there be paid to Mr. *Duport*, for his Services therein mentioned the Sum of £40.

Ordered, That a Message be sent to the Council accordingly.

The Council sent down the Bill relating to the Market with a Message, that they had agreed to the same, with an Amendment, to which they desire the Concurrence of this House.

The Council sent down a Bill, intituled *An Act in further Addition to an Act made in the 32^d Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled An Act for preventing Trespasses*, with a Message, that they desire the Concurrence of this House to the same,

And the said Bill was read a 1st and 2^d Time, and *ordered* to be committed, and having been committed accordingly, was reported, agreed to with Amendments,

Ordered, That the Bill be sent up to the Council with a Message, that the House had agreed to the same; with Amendments; to which Amendments the House desire the Concurrence of the Council.
