little stockaded forts, which are erected for that purpose; those who have been hardy enough to remain in their houses have been butchered without exception; fuch is the fituation of this communication for the space of seventy miles; the rest (if we except lake Oneida, twenty-eight miles in length) is one continued defile, in any fingle part of which a body of men, tho' prepared for action, is liable to be cut off by an enemy not equal even to the third part of their own numbers; what then must be the fate of those numerous loaded boats, which for the fupport of these forts must necessarily be continually passing thro' this defile (if a narrow river whose banks are either high scarped rocks, or covered with thick woods, may be called a defile?) what I fay must be the fate of these boats,
